



#### What is an EMS?

- An EMS is a management approach for addressing environmental aspects of internal operations and activities.
- EMS implementation is based on the "Plan, Do, Check, Act" model using standard processes in order to:
  - oldentify current activities and risks
  - Establish goals
  - Implement plans to meet goals
  - Evaluate progress
  - Continuous improvement

#### What is VEEP?

- Voluntary program recognizing Virginia facilities that go above and beyond environmental compliance.
- Two types of participation:
  - Facility-Based Track
  - Sustainability Partners (SP) Track
- VEEP members are committed to continuous improvement and pollution prevention





#### **VEEP EMS Track Structure**

- **E2** Facilities interested in beginning an EMS or in the early stages of implementing an EMS and pollution prevention program.
- E3 Facilities with a fully-implemented EMS and pollution prevention program with documented results.
- **E4** Facilities with a fully-implemented EMS, that has been verified by an independent 3<sup>rd</sup> party, and that have committed to measures for sustainable environmental progress and community involvement.
- All facilities must have a record of sustained compliance.

### Taking the First Step – E2 Basics

- Environmental Policy Statement Includes a commitment to compliance, pollution prevention, training, communication, and continuous improvement.
- Evaluation of Aspects and Impacts A comprehensive list of aspects and impacts, a method for determining significance, and a process outlined for aspect review and reevaluation.
- Objectives and Targets Goals addressing significant aspects with tasks planned for implementation and tracking results.
- Pollution Prevention Plan A listing of projects and accomplishments including reduction number and cost savings.





### Portal Dashboard w/ VEEP Report Access





# **Environmental Commitment Reporting**

The '+' is used when a commitment has run its three year cycle and you wish to continue to report on that commitment for another three year cycle.

To the extent possible on this page, quanitfy the results of the Member's environmental management system and/or pollution prevention program.

VEEP Members are required to make commitments and track impact reductions. The commitments typically last for the term of the membership (3 years).

E2 members must track at least 1 commitment.

E3 members must track at least 2 commitments.

E4 members must track at least 3 commitments and report on commitments to sustainable environmental programs and community involvement (in the Additional Information section).

Click to update data for each commitment within the current year report.

▶ Click 🛨 if you wish to continue reporting on a commitment that completed the 3 year cycle last year.

Click to remove the commitment from the current year report. Note that clicking in the first year of a commitment will permanently delete the commitment from the data system.

During only the first year of reporting on a commitment you may:







Recycling efforts are being expanded at DEQ with new materials being added to the recycling stream along with efforts to raise awareness about recycling. Increased recycling in 2017 may be attributed to the Central Office moving to a new building. The surge in 2017 recycling at the Central Office was followed by a massive drop off in 2018, after the move to the BOA Building.

The agency efforts to reduce paper use may also contribute to a drop in the recycling rate.





# **Submit Report**

Linked Facilties



Once your report is complete and submitted you will get an email confirmation.



### **Report Review**

- DEQ staff will review submitted reports.
- If a completed report needs to be updated, you will be contacted and asked to make updates or provide more information.
- Once a report has been reviewed and approved by DEQ staff you will be notified via email.



### Report Review cont.

- Approximately 200 reports submitted
- Almost 400 reporting commitments reviewed
- Usually, \$50 million dollars in savings reported

RECYCLED WATER USE INCREASED BY 224,135,883 GALLONS

This is enough water for approximately 2,050 families for one year.\*\*

GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS
REDUCED BY 6,225 TONS

The equivalent of removing over 1,200 cars from the road for one year.\*\*\*

AMOUNT OF WASTE RECYCLED INCREASED BY 5,258 TONS

Equivalent to 170 times the weight of the Statue of Liberty.\*\*\*\*
