Cumberland County will realize significant tax revenue from the jobs created by the construction and management of the facility; the construction and operation of the Green Ridge Facility will provide employment and job opportunities for heavy equipment operators, truck drivers, mechanics, geologists, engineers, management and administrative staff, general laborers, as well as third party contractors. Section 10.1-1307E of the Code of Virginia specifies that the Department, in issuing a permit, shall consider facts and circumstances relevant to the reasonableness of the activity involved and the regulations proposed to control it, including:

- §10.1-1307E.2 The social and economic value of the activity involved, and
- §10.1-1307E.3 The suitability of the activity to the area in which it is located, except that consideration of this factor shall be satisfied if the local governing body of a locality in which a facility or activity is proposed has resolved that the location and operation of the proposed facility or activity is suitable to the area in which it is located.

Explanation

The Department's duty to consider the relevant facts and circumstances for §10.1-1307E.3 (as described above) for this application is satisfied by the local governing body completing Section 2 of this form; however, a local governing body may utilize another written communication method.
