

Environmental Justice (EJ) Policies



EPA EJ Policy

Environmental justice is defined by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, faith, national origin, or income, in the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

No population, especially minority, lowincome, or historically-underserved communities, should face higher levels or greater impacts of pollution than other populations. Some of these communities face more severe environmental degradation, which disproportionally affects public health and quality of life.

Virginia EJ Act

The Virginia Environmental Justice
Act states, "It is the policy of the
Commonwealth to promote environmental
justice and ensure that it is carried out
throughout the Commonwealth, with a
focus on environmental justice
communities and fenceline communities."

It further defines as, "the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of every person, regardless of race, color, national origin, income, faith, or disability, regarding the development, implementation, or enforcement of any environmental law, regulation, or policy."



Environmental Justice Community Screenings indicate

Alexandria (pop. 94,501)

- 22% are low income
- 61% are people of color
- Considered a disadvantaged community (inflation/industry)
- 6% of adults have less than High School Diploma
- 8% limited English household
- 7% under 5 years old
- 12% over age 64

Fairfax-Lorton (pop. 26,887)

- 14% are low income
- 66% are people of color
- Considered a disadvantaged community (inflation/industry)
- 8% of adults have less than High School Diploma
- 6% limited English household
- 5% under 5 years old
- 11% over age 64


How Do Our Emissions Compare to Other Sources in the County?
