Subject: Authorization of FY 2025 SLAF Project Funding List

Purpose

The Virginia General Assembly created and set forth specific parameters for the administration of the Stormwater Local Assistance Fund (SLAF) by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in 2013. The SLAF program provides matching grants to local governments for the planning, design, and implementation of stormwater best management practices in order to reduce water quality pollutant loads. In accordance with legislation, the State Water Control Board (Board) approved guidelines for the implementation of the SLAF program in 2013, with those guidelines revised most recently by the Board in June 2022. The guidelines call for an annual solicitation of applications, an application review and ranking process, and the authorization of a Project Funding List by the Director of DEQ.

To date, 357 projects totaling approximately \$212 million have been authorized. The tenth solicitation for SLAF applications was conducted for fiscal year (FY) 2025, and the applications received by DEQ have been evaluated in accordance with the approved guidelines. This memorandum provides the results of the evaluation and DEQ staff recommendations for approval.

Applications Received

On August 1, 2024, DEQ solicited SLAF applications from all local governments in the Commonwealth with an October 1, 2024, deadline for submission. DEQ received applications from 22 localities totaling \$37,073,245 for 27 stormwater projects and 4 nutrient credit purchases. In addition, the General Assembly appropriated \$10,000,000 for eight projects within two localities that were reviewed during this evaluation.

Funding Availability for FY 2025

In FY 2024, no additional SLAF funding was provided to DEQ and the remaining unobligated balance totaled \$58,663,103, with \$10,000,000 restricted based on General Assembly appropriation to the City of Falls Church (\$9,000,000) and York County (\$1,000,000). As a result, \$48,663,103 is available for the FY 2025 award cycle.

Application Evaluations

All 35 stormwater projects and 4 nutrient credit purchase projects were evaluated in accordance with the program's eligibility requirements and priority ranking criteria, with the funding amount requested totaling

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\$47,073,245. After review of the applications, it was determined that several projects did not meet eligibility requirements and staff recommend denial of the projects noted in Table 3.

In accordance with the SLAF Guidelines, the project funding list was drafted to provide the greatest financial and environmental benefit to as many communities as possible. Staff recommends waiving the maximum grant amount of \$5,000,000 per locality due to adequate funding for the FY 2025 SLAF projects, resulting in Fairfax and Loudoun Counties receiving \$7,959,800 and \$5,453,790, respectively.

Conclusion and Staff Recommendation

Following a thorough evaluation of eligibility, priority ranking, funding availability, and site visits several projects, the proposed Project Funding List for the tenth round of SLAF funding includes 22 stormwater projects and 4 nutrient credit purchases as noted in Table 1, along with 8 projects specifically funded by General Assembly appropriations as noted in Table 2. The total FY 2025 grant award authorization request is \$41,988,162 for 34 projects across 19 localities. Without further appropriation or changes to obligations, the amount remaining for the FY2026 SLAF Solicitation is \$16,674,941.

DEQ staff recommend the Director of DEQ authorize the enclosed Project Funding List which includes localities and projects for SLAF matching grant assistance, subject to compliance with the program requirements and the receipt of construction bids.
