DEQ 101 – Who We Are & What We Do

What is the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)?

DEQ is the primary environmental permitting agency in the Commonwealth of Virginia, and we are responsible for administering laws and regulations related to air quality, water quality, water supply, renewable energy and land protection.



DEQ's Mission is to protect and enhance the environment of Virginia in order to promote the health and well-being of the Commonwealth's citizens, residents, and visitors in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.



DEQ's Vision is that all Virginians enjoy cleaner water, better air quality, and the productive reuse of land that was once contaminated.

Who are we?

We are over 800 professionals who apply science and law to protect and enhance Virginia's environment in our Air, Water, and Land Programs, as well as other programs that affect all media and support the work of our colleagues.



What do we do?

Within our cross-media programs, we engage in a variety of interconnected functions. For instance, environmental monitoring data informs our planning processes. Additionally, both monitoring and planning data are utilized when modeling the potential impacts of proposed permits.


