- 1. HOLISTIC (Qualitative & Quantitative) ASSESSMENT OF RESILIENCE
 - Simple, accessible, & objective assessment
- 2. SETTING PRIORITIES
 - Community workshop
 - Resilience Action Checklist (RAC)
- 3. IMPLEMENTATION
 - Locality Implementation Teams to pursue RAC items
 - 1-year of support and assistance
