


WETLANDS WATCH & THE CRS PROGRAM


- Decade of experience providing floodplain management technical assistance to Virginia localities

- Conduct case studies and research on the implementation of the CRS






WETLANDS WATCH & THE CRS PROGRAM









CRS TRAINING/ASSESSMENT OVERVIEW

- Wetlands Watch has conducted 5-hour CRS training intensives with localities interested in exploring what is takes to join the program
 - We assist them in scoring their existing actions and evaluating the costs and benefits to joining
- This training has been given to more than 20 VA communities → Biggest barrier to join = capacity to enroll & maintain status
- Training Deliverable:
 - FEMA Quick Check
 - "Advanced Quick Check:" state specific + locality info for activities
 - Report for estimated CRS class & associated insurance discount savings – marketing doc for decision making boards



CRS WORKSHOPS: GAP FILLING


- Gap in CRS resources available to under-resourced communities
- Need for remote learning: COVID & limited travel \$\$
- Our goal: to provide "what CRS communities really need to know" & bypass overwhelm caused by manual
- We developed three workshops:
 - CRS Introduction Workshop
 - CRS Activity 330 Workshop
 - CRS Activity 450 Workshop





CRS TRAINING: INTRO TO THE CRS


- Workshop intended to give:
 - introduction to the National Flood Insurance Program and the new rating methodology (RR 2.0)
 - overview of the Community Rating System (CRS) Program
 - provide insight on what it takes for a locality to join the CRS Program
- ClassMarker hosts the assessment and the training videos are streamed via YouTube
- 3 CECs for CFMs





CRS TRAINING: ACTIVITY 330


- This training is intended to give an overview of Activity 330:
 - Outreach Projects (OP)
 - Flood Response Preparations (FRP)
 - Program for Public Information (PPI)
 - Stakeholder Delivery (STK)
- Each section will cover info on how to receive, calculate, and document credit for each element
- Course eligible for 2 CECs





CRS TRAINING: ACTIVITY 450

- Workshop content is broken up into two videos:
 - Part 1 Overview of Activity 450
 and Element Stormwater
 Management Regulations (SMR)
 - Part 2 Elements: Watershed Master Plan (WMP), Erosion and Sedimentation Control Guidelines (ESC), and Water Quality Regulations (WQR)
- Course is eligible for 2 CECs






TRAINING PREVIEW





LEARNING ASSESSMENT PREVIEW

- Registrants complete learning videos, have the option to download presentation materials, and complete a learning assessment
- Costs \$25 per registrant
- Each workshop provides2-3 hours of content





EXPECTATION VS. REALITY

- By developing and offering this training, WW could have developed a stream of modest revenue and
- User feedback has been positive!
- **However...** the intended audience **is not engaging** with these trainings to the extent anticipated
- We attribute this to potential barriers:
 - Cost of registration
 - Lack of capacity
 - Availability of ISO 1-hour trainings
 - Continuing education requirements elsewhere fulfilled (VA CRS Workgroup fulfills CECs required)



FLOOD RISK DISCLOSURE

- Campaign for state based CRS credits disclosure at the time of a real estate transfer:
 - 100- and 500-year flood zones
 - community flood zones
 - prior flood damages and claims
- If adopted, this code could be eligible for Activity 340: Hazard Disclosure

ROLLING CONSERVATION EASEMENT = CONSERVATION EASEMENT

Legal Instrument: Conservation Easement (Deed of Restrictions)

Land Owner: Elizabeth River Project

<u>Conservation Easement Holder</u>: Coastal VA Conservancy Full use of land, with some conservation-based restrictions


Restrictions

- No additional structures on the site
- No obstruction of wetlands migration
- Cannot occupy site when sea level rise takes over site

Coastal VA Conservancy enforces the restrictions
